Sir Anthony Hope Hawkins (February 9, 1863 - July 8, 1933), better known as Anthony Hope was a British novelist, born in London, and best remembered today for his short novel *The Prisoner of Zenda* (1894), set in the fictional kingdom of Ruritania, a prequel *The Heart of Princess Osra* (a collection of short stories set in 18C Ruritania) (1896) and a sequel *Rupert of Hentzau* (1898). His first novel was *A Man of Mark* (1890), and one of his most well-known works during his lifetime was *The Dolly Dialogues* (1894), published in the *Westminster Gazette*.
